
ASSET FORFEITURE NEW DATA FROM 11 TEXAS COUNTIES¹




From 2011 to 2013

law enforcement seized more than \$104 MILLION in assets and less than \$14 MILLION was returned to defendants



Law enforcement in Texas can retain up to 90% of asset forfeiture funds.²

From 2011 to 2013 Texas law enforcement agencies spent more than \$87.5 MILLION of forfeited funds.



WHAT IS LAW ENFORCEMENT BUYING WITH FORFEITURE FUNDS? (2011 TO 2013)

\$41+ MILLION on EQUIPMENT

\$20+ MILLION on SALARIES & OVERTIME

\$6+ MILLION on FACILITY COSTS

\$4.5+ MILLION on MISC. FEES

Law enforcement agencies should not have an incentive to fill budget gaps with forfeiture funds. Many law enforcement uses for forfeiture funds should be accounted for through regular budgeting processes and fund sources, not based on the assumption that forfeiture funds will account for shortfalls.

SALARIES & OVERTIME: A CLOSER LOOK (2013)

Cameron County: 97 employees are paid using forfeiture funds & \$643,501 of forfeiture funds are spent on increase of salary, expense or allowance for employees Dallas County: \$499,950 of forfeiture funds spent on overtime for employees budgeted by governing body

Harris County: 1,844 employees are paid using forfeiture funds & \$3,317,744 of forfeiture funds are spent on overtime for employees budgeted by governing body

The laws that allow for asset forfeiture should ensure that forfeited property is clearly associated with the crime for which the property is purportedly forfeited.

ACCOUNTABILITY

THERE ARE NO REPORTING REQUIREMENTS REGARDING:

Whether charges were brought in connection with the offense providing a basis for the forfeiture and the disposition of those charges.

Whether the forfeiture resulted from a legal stop/arrest or by some other means.

What types of crimes most often provide the basis for a civil forfeiture?
