

Hurricane Fiona: Applications for Individual Assistance - 10/1/2022

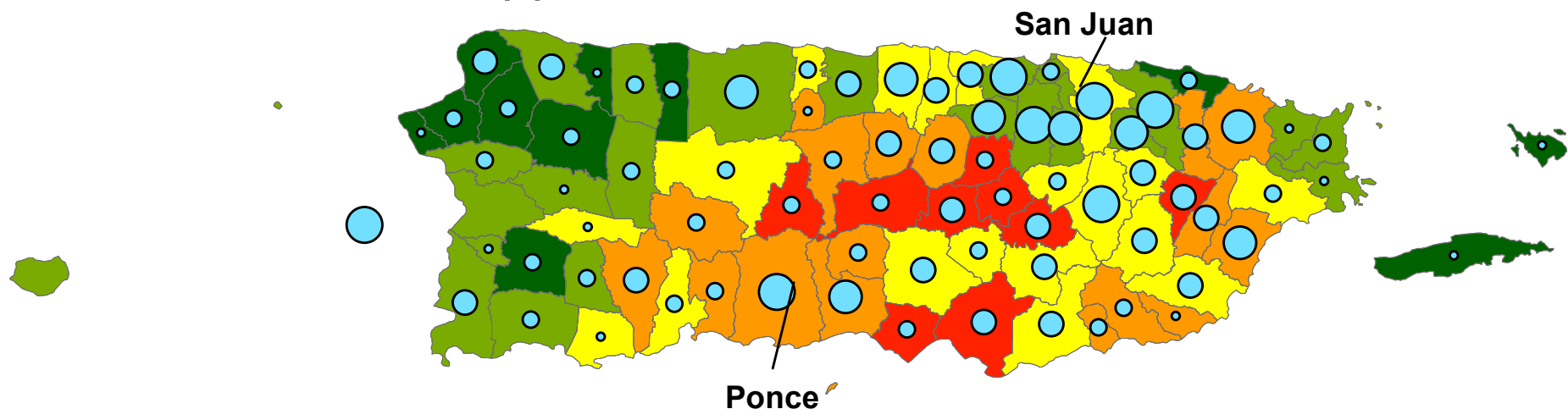


Figure: Map of Total Individual Assistance Applications and Applications per Household as of October 1, 2022

Total Applications: 775,891

New Applications: 616,027

Total Inspections: 11,021

New Inspections: 10,967

- 775,891 applications is equal to 67 applications per 100 Households. It is approximately 70% of the applications after Hurricane Maria.

- The municipios with the most applications are the population centers of San Juan (74,000) Bayamon (42,000), Ponce (41,000), and Carolina (33,000).

- The most affected municipios, as measured by applications per household are in the southeast - Salinas and Santa Isabel, as well as the inner municipios of Barranquita, Cidra, Comerio, Jayuya, Naranbrito, and Orocovis.

Inspections, Eligibility, and Awards

11,021 Inspections have been performed, about 1 for every 70 applications. 54 inspections had been performed as of 9/24/2022

- 26% of applicants have been found to be eligible for an assistance. Of these, 98% received \$700, the default award for Critical Needs Assistance.

As applications are processed, it is expected that more applicants will be approved, and awards in addition the \$700 Critical Needs Assistance will be granted.
