

# ARTICLE IV, RIDER #14: HB1 (HOUSE) COURT TEXT REMINDER PROGRAM FACT SHEET 2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

# WHAT THE RIDER DOES

Last session, the 87<sup>th</sup> Legislature passed HB 4293, which created a statewide court text messaging reminder system under the Office of Court Administration (OCA).<sup>1</sup> While well intentioned, this piece of legislation was passed unfunded. Rider #14 under Article IV of the House version of HB1, seeks to fund this mandate by dedicating \$2.2 million dollars to the development and maintenance of this system.<sup>2</sup> Text message reminders have been empirically shown to reduce failure to appear rates in court, by more than a quarter.<sup>3</sup> By supporting the inclusion and dedication of these funds into the state's budget, lawmakers can ensure that Texas is moving towards effective and data-driven approaches to justice.

### **RESEARCH SUPPORTING FUNDING REQUEST**

Research shows that *any* type of court reminder be it via phone call,<sup>4</sup> postcard,<sup>5</sup> or text message,<sup>6</sup> improves court appearance rates. The latter being the most cost-effective, given its "simple-user benefits"<sup>7</sup> and low-cost delivery.<sup>8</sup> **The benefit that courts across the state stand to gain from the use of this system, is significant.** In one high volume municipal jurisdiction – where more than 320,000 citations are issued annually – researchers found a 21% reduction in their court's failure to appear (FTA) rates to be attributable to the implementation of a text message reminder system.<sup>9</sup>

Even higher reduction rates can be seen when these reminders include comprehensive information. For example, including appearance details, such as the date, time, and location with a map, has shown to be associated with a 23.5% reduction in FTA rates, while including consequences for failing to appear (e.g., additional fines/fees, warrant for arrest, potential jail time) has shown to result in a 26% reduction.<sup>10</sup> Text message reminder systems are **an effective way to improve court appearance rates while simultaneously promoting trust in the courts**.<sup>11</sup> By funding text-based court reminders through the OCA lawmakers can help ensure that all counties, regardless of size and budget, have access to an effective tool to achieve compliance.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

Texas Appleseed urges conference members to retain Rider #14, under Article IV in the House version of HB1. The benefits that the state stands to gain from financially supporting the OCA's text messaging reminder program are threefold:



The administrative efficiency of courts to manage appearance rates and backlogs will be improved.

Taxpayers will reap the financial benefits associated with a more cost-effective approach.
